I PASTORAL LEADERSHIP EXPERIENCE

During my 15-year tenure at Lavon Drive, God has taken us on an amazing journey of church revitalization, completing a \$10,000,000 renovation in 2020, adding a second English service, and launching a Spanish service. Weekly Sunday attendance is hovering around 1000, up from just 500 a few years ago. When I came on staff, I had one staff member and a small volunteer team under my direction. I built a large orchestra, expanded children and youth music programs, produced two albums with the choir, performed with the choir at Carnegie Hall, and hosted numerous concerts with well-known artists. The Lord blessed our team with a Dove-award nominated composer as our pianist, and at another time one of the nation's top church music composers. Today, I lead 100+ volunteers and 10 paid staff across the Music, Communications, and Awaken Coffee House teams, having developed and launched the latter two departments. In its first two years of operation, Awaken Coffee House has booked over \$290,000 in revenue, supports a staff of four, and has provided over 40,000 meals to poor kids in Nicaragua and hundreds of bags of supplies for foster care agencies in North Texas. I am passionate about missions and camp ministry, have led 14 trips to Colorado, Nicaragua, and Mexico, and serve on the administrative team for our Children's Camp that ministers to over 300 kids annually. During our years of revitalization, I served as Interim Executive Pastor and twice as Interim Student pastor, seeing growth in the youth department during that time and establishing a robust student leadership team. As a current member of the executive team, I partner with our Senior Pastor and Executive Pastor on many of the strategic decisions that God has used to navigate the revitalization process, and today I'm able to share that experience with other ministers as I speak at conferences nationwide.

### I SALVATION AND CALL TO MINISTRY

I grew up outside Longmont, Colorado in a Christian home where God was an ever-present and welcome part of our family. At the age of nine, I made a sincere decision to follow Christ, confessing my sin and inadequacy and calling upon God for His grace, forgiveness, and salvation. While I had my ups and downs through high school, I never departed from my belief and commitment to follow Christ.

My parents both served in music ministry at Rocky Mountain Christian Church in Niwot, where my mom also worked several years on staff. I participated in and later led the student worship team and served in numerous student leadership capacities. It was in that context that God called me to full-time music ministry, and I surrendered to that call as a high school senior, having previously planned to follow in my father's footsteps as an I/T professional. Providentially, God has used my aptitude and passion for computer science and technology to serve the Church in many unique ways ever since, and I'm grateful for the unique but exciting journey He's prepared for my life.

### I PHILOSOPHY OF WORSHIP MINISTRY

Worship is a central feature of God's plan for the church, and that plan involves much more than music. Worship is in fact the act of ascribing supreme worth to God, something that should be a feature of all that we do. But throughout Scripture, music is the single-most common method by which the people of God join together in corporate worship. In the Old Testament, hundreds of Levites were set apart by God for the sole purpose of worship in song that continued both day and night (1 Chronicles 9:33). In Ephesians 5:19 and Colossians 3:16, Paul exhorts us to worship with "psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs." In Isaiah 6:3 and in Revelation 4:8, angels come before God singing continually of His holiness. There can be no doubt of the centrality of music in corporate worship. What we see in Scripture is that music is a tool not only for ascribing to God the worth He is due, but it is a tool for unifying the congregation, multiplying the proclamation of God's greatness, demonstrating to all in attendance our devotion to God, as well as reinforcing great, Biblical truths through the memorization that comes through careful planning of quality, doctrinally-sound worship music. Music connects the facts of the faith with our feelings, and by internalizing our core doctrines, God becomes very real and very personal. Songs experienced as a congregation not only establish the Word in the hearts of the people, but they enhance the church's sense of community and collective heritage.

Music itself is an art form and is deeply specific to particular demographics and cultures. As such, it is always important to tailor a church's musical identity to the identity of its people. Some churches thrive on restrained, traditional hymnody that tends toward the majestic while others worship more expressively, connecting with styles and texts that feel more organic and personal. Neither is better than the other, but it's important for any musical leader to tailor the music to the church, not vice versa. I personally have a deep appreciation for both ancient hymnody and modern music. I connect the most with the more organic, personal nature of modern worship music, but as an intellectual I also value and love the hymns and the many great "modern hymns" that are being produced by people like Keith and Kristyn Getty, CityAlight, etc. Regardless of my personal tastes, however, the selection of style for any church I serve would only begin to take shape once I understand the culture and heart language of that church. My musical experience is such that I can fit easily into just about any context.
